Linking to this commitment, Bangladesh needs to calculate national benchmarks values for seven key SDG4 indicators and send to UNESCO and UIS by 1st of October 2021. Objectives:

The key purpose of the meeting is to follow up the invitation from UNESCO ADG in establishingnational benchmarks for the SDG 4 indicators and establish realistic national benchmarks for SDG 4 in Bangladesh aligning with its national policies and strategies. The specific objectives of the meeting are to:

- Update on Regional SDG 4 benchmarks indicators, methodologies, and data sources;
- Review of Bangladesh national policies, plans and strategies and the associated targets;
- Discuss on the process of setting up of national benchmark values;
- Complete the template to be submitted to UNESCO as a national voluntary contribution to the benchmarking process.
